How to Remedy Too Much Technology for our Kids and Ourselves, Talk by Bente Goldstein


On Friday evening, April 13, from 6:30 to 8 p.m., Tamarack is proud to present Bente Goldstein as a guest speaker. Bente is a former Waldorf class teacher and she runs Farmwise Education--in which children are educated via hands-on farm work--from the Elkhorn-area farm she owns with her husband, Walter. Childcare will be available for a small fee during the presentation; please watch for a signup sheet outside of the office.

The topic of the talk will be "**How to Remedy Too Much Technology for our Kids and Ourselves**": *The purpose of inventing all our machines in our technological age was for these to do all the hard work for us. This is both a good thing and a bad thing. Because we are making ourselves more and more obsolete as humans, our children can arrive at the conclusion of not being sure why they are here. Children find meaning when they are doing stuff with us. Children find meaning when they are participants, not just onlookers. Children find meaning when they see themselves for real acquiring a new capacity. That is because they found two things: both the world and a bit of themselves.*
